2022 Legislative Competitiveness Certificate Winners Announced

The *VMAPAC 2022 Legislative Competitiveness Certificate* was created by the VMAPAC to recognize Virginia Legislators who demonstrate support for a pro-manufacturing legislative agenda each year during the General Assembly Session, as measured by their voting record. The *Certificate* recognizes legislators that vote 70% or more with the VMA position on select priority and defensive priority bills as scored by the VMAPAC Legislative Competitiveness Scorecard. 80 priority and defensive priority bills were scored this year to determine the percentage of votes cast in agreement with the VMA's position. The Certificate is not a blanket endorsement of any candidate or political party; rather, it is an honored designation for a legislator at a specific point in time for all manufacturers, retirees, and allies to recognize.
